

LEVEL 2 CARPENTRY AND JOINERY

The occupation involves carrying out skilled work, primarily using timber products, either on a construction site or in a workshop, creating and installing building components. A Site Carpenter will normally work on a building site, or in domestic and commercial premises, preparing and fixing building components, from the initial erection of a new building, through to the installation of all necessary fixtures and fittings, as well as a range of repair and maintenance activities.

INDUCTION

One day induction to Apprenticeship programme, meeting with a Skills Coach and Delivery Plan agreed.

IN COLLEGE

Weekly classroom and workshop based lessons during term time and monthly Skills Coach support sessions for the duration of the programme

ASSESSMENT

On programme assessments every 6-8 weeks, including progress reviews every 8-10 weeks.

END POINT ASSESSMENT

- A Knowledge Assessment (exam)
- A Practical Skills Assessment

GATEWAY

- Professional Qualification
- Apprentices without Level 2 English and mathematics will need to achieve this level prior to taking their End Point Assessment (EPA).

QUALIFICATION

- Level 2 Diploma in Wood
- Occupations – Site
- Carpentry Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) 'Skilled Worker' standard, which is widely accepted in the sector as a 'licence to operate' in a skilled construction trade.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Maths and English GCSE Grades 9 - 2 or Functional Skills Entry Level 3 or initial assessment results at Entry Level 3. Individuals requiring additional support are required to participate in an intensive week programme; otherwise, they are mandated to attend weekly sessions.
